
#2-f: Proposal for 2 additional residential seats on Board of Directors:

6 neighborhood districts (NW, Middle/Center West, SW, NE, Middle/Central East, NW)



<u>Proposed boundaries #2</u>: Split 2 west districts into 4 districts and slightly move old north-south line to the east.

6 neighborhood districts (NW, North Middle/Center, SW, NE, South Middle/Center, NW)
